

## Lyveden/Stanion A (319)

---

1150-1400

Potteries in East Northamptonshire villages.

Big pots, thick walled sherds. Biggest lumps of shell which are quite sparse and unevenly scattered. Sometimes lumps of iron ore. Double beaded rims shaped by sheep toe bones (metatarsal)! Pots usually grey with blue-grey to brown surfaces although there are other surface colours such as buff, red, purple and orange. Usually jars or bowls, but also jugs, storage jars and curfews.
